From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

August has been a full month at St. Paul's and St. John's. As I write this, we just had a great worship service together at the park in La Motte. The sound of Sam Giere's bagpipes called us to worship, and together we heard God's Word and received the Lord's Supper. The polluck that followed was fantastic, and altogether it was a wonderful way to spend a Sunday morning.

I give thanks to God for each of the Sunday mornings we've been able to spend together. It makes me think about what Martin Luther wrote in the Large Catechism, about how the point of Sundays and other holidays is gathering together, not only for a day of rest and refreshment—which our bodies need and which God intends for our wellbeing—but most importantly for hearing God's Word. Luther writes:

"On the other hand, when we seriously ponder the Word, hear it, and put it to use, such is its power that it never departs without fruit. It always awakens new understanding, pleasure, and devotion, and it constantly creates clean minds and hearts."

Of course, Sunday mornings are not the only time that we gather together as people of faith, in groups off all kinds. Next summer, the National Youth Gathering, will be in Houston, TX, where 35,000 Lutheran Youth from all over the country gather for worship, service, learning; and fellowship. It's looking like St. John's and St. Paul's will have a number of youth attending and I'm working with other pastors in Jackson County and Clinton County on travel plans. If you know a youth (those entering 8th-12th grade this fall) who might be interested in going, please let me know. I'd like to have commitments from those who plan on attending by September 15th.

One other event that I'm really excited about is St. John's "Rally Sunday," a carnival-themed event aimed at building interest in the Sunday School. It promises to be a ton of fun! Look for ways that you can get involved and more details elsewhere in this newsletter. Sunday school will be starting up at both congregations in September (the 10th at St. John's and the 17th at St. Paul's) and will be at 9:30 at both churches. Confirmation classes will be starting in September, too, though we're still working on scheduling those sessions.

I pray that God's blessings will be with you all this month, especially those students and teachers returning to class. May your teaching and learning work for the good of God's people and God's world.
