From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

September seems like a good time to talk about being church together. On Sunday, September 8th, our congregations will have the opportunity to participate in "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday. That same day, churches throughout the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America will also be doing service projects. You can find more details on our specific project elsewhere in this newsletter. It's amazing to think of all the ways our church will be helping people around the country and around the world all at once! We can do big things when we work as the church together.

I saw an amazing example of that recently when the ELCA congregations of the greater Dubuque area came together to host a benefit at Wartburg Theological Seminary for Almost Home Guest House, a ministry of St. John's in Dubuque that works with homeless men. That event raised almost \$8,000, and after they added in gifts in kind of supplies, food, clothing, and other items, they figure that they received the equivalent of nearly \$10,000 in total! That's going to go a long way toward helping people in need get back on their feet, and our congregations got to be a part of it! Some of our members helped transport the stage for the band and get it set up at Wartburg. Even those of you who weren't able to be directly involved were still connected to that amazing work, since as your pastor, I was able to work with the other Dubuque-area pastors and take a (small) part in helping to put it together. Oh, and it's not too late to get involved, even though this year's benefit is over. Almost Home can always use volunteers, donations, and prayers! You can talk to me if you're interesting in connecting with Almost Home to volunteer or donate. And, in terms of things coming full-circle, it's worth mentioning that when St. John's was first getting started in the 1850s, we even briefly shared a pastor with St. John's Dubuque.

The whole church is better when we work together. Of course, these congregations know that as well as any! After 105 years of shared ministry, working together for the sake of the Gospel and for the sake of the world is part of our DNA, so to speak. Our theology shares that commitment, too. We can look as far back as the very early history of the old Iowa Synod, the church body that St. John's and St. Paul's were originally part of. One thing that set the Iowa Synod apart was the idea of "open questions," which basically means that we don't have to think exactly the same way about every single point of doctrine in order to still be Christ's church together and be in communion with one another. That's not to say that it doesn't matter what you believe, but it does mean that we can have disagreements without it being church-dividing. That idea of "open questions" was a huge gift that the Iowa Synod passed on to the ALC and then the ELCA. If you're very familiar with other Lutheran denominations, you'll understand that this idea of "open questions" is not appreciated as much by all Lutherans. It became a real sticking point between the Iowa Synod and the Missouri Synod in the 1870s, and you can still see a difference between the ELCA and the Missouri Synod when it comes to that sort of thing today.
