From the Pastor's Desk

Happy Easter! Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

By the time you are reading this newsletter, we have just celebrated the most holy week of the church year. It's also my very favorite time to be in church worshiping with you all. The services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil are so moving and powerful. Many of you will have already attended those services, but if you've never been to them, I thought it might be worth sharing part of what I wrote last year about those services. Perhaps if they haven't been part of your regular worship practice, I hope you'll consider participating in them next year (or tonight, in the case of the Vigil for some of you who get the *Parish Twine* electronically on Saturday).

On Maundy Thursday, we began a time that has been known since ancient times as the Three Days or *Triduum* (tri-DO-em): Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Vigil of Easter, all leading up to Easter Sunday.

The Three Days really tell one story, from Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples and his arrest in the garden of Gethsemane on Maundy Thursday, through his trial, crucifixion, and death on the cross on Good Friday, through the story of the light and life of the resurrection overcoming the darkness of the tomb at the Easter Vigil. These three seemingly separate services come together to form one powerful, moving experience of worship, and each night is significant in its own way. Maundy Thursday has us remember Jesus giving us the Lord's Supper or Holy Communion, and ends with the somber practice of stripping the altar. Good Friday is a solemn reminder of how Jesus, the Son of God, loved us enough to give his own life for us.

The Vigil of Easter is the newest practice in our communities, although it's actually the most ancient of the three. The Vigil begins outside the church, just as night begins to fall. We light a "new fire" to remember how the light of Jesus' rising shines throughout the world, and the darkness will never overcome it. We will pass the light from that new fire to one another as we process into the church and sing God's praises first by candlelight. In that sense, you could almost think of the Easter Vigil being to Easter what Christmas Eve is to Christmas. The high point of the service is when we sing Alleluia to welcome the Easter Gospel reading and the lights in the church are turned up, the altar candles are lit, and the church bell rings all through that song of praise until we finally say together, "Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!" Some years, we have had the opportunity to celebrate a baptism at the Easter Vigil, which was the traditional service for baptism of new Christians in the early church. This year, though we will not have a baptism at that service, we will all have an opportunity to affirm our baptismal faith. If you haven't attended the Easter Vigil before, I hope you'll consider participating in this beautiful, unique experience of worship.

And of course, Easter Sunday will once again bring joyful worship services, too as we celebrate the Good News of Jesus' resurrection!

I hope and pray that you and your loved ones have a joyous and blessed Easter!

St. John's Council Meeting—March 4:

Meeting called to order by Richard Busch

Members present: Pastor Will, Richard Busch, Judy Hueneke-Kremer, Mark Hueneke, Duane Tietjen, Tom Harmon, Deb Decker, Peggy Post and Julie Busch. Peggy welcomed as new member to the Council.

Devotions: Provided by Pastor

Pastor Report: Pastor expressed appreciation and thanked everyone for office setup stating it has worked well with the meetings he has already conducted Written report was provided.

Secretary Report: Judy will update 2/5/24 report stating Episcopal Church Pension fund is 1 month behind due to billing not received.

Treasurer Report: BSB checking; MIF; Sunday School; Memorial Fund - Payment was made for office furniture.

Old Business:

Building and Grounds: Mark accepted final bid for \$111,000 from TNT. Bid covers everything on outside except the lower windows in the basement. Roof is \$83,279 for a total cost of \$194,658. Tentatively scheduled for late summer. TNT will take about 1 to 1 ½ month and Eli's roofing will take 10 days to 2 weeks. Color of roof still needs to be determined.

Fundraising: Kick Off is scheduled for April 13, 2024. On 7/14/2024 there will be a Vintage Tractor Pull on flat ground behind housing and B&G area. There is a proposal for the two churches of St. Donatus to join together and man the food stand with proceeds split between the two churches. Menu will be simple and more information to follow.

Trinity Parish Committee update:

Maundy Thursday services at St. John's at 6:00 p.m. and St. Paul's at 7:30 p.m. with Mark Oehlert.

St. John's will have a Good Friday service at noon.

Rev Laurie will have an Easter sunrise service starting in the cemetery.

Salem is doing a brunch after their Easter Service and have extended an invitation to other parishes. Time will be approximately 10:30 a.m.

On May 5, at the St. John's and St. Paul's services, Rev Laurie will be installed and Pastor Will to be installed at Salem's service. Bishop Amy will preach at each service. Jeronimo's will cater the meal at Salem following their service. Committee is planning for 100 meals. Thrivent cards will be requested

August 18 will be Worship in the Park with a potluck meal to follow. St. John's to provide beverages, utensils, and plates as needed. Possibly there will be a joint choir. Volunteers are needed from each church for readings, offering, and communion assistants.

September 8, a Civil War Reenactment will take place in Maquoketa. A Salem member is on the committee. Pastor is scheduled to be at Salem that day and is to do a 1860 timeframe service on the battle-field. It will follow the 1860 services that are currently done at Gettysburg.

Pastor and Rev Laurie have been using their own computers. Cost to provide them with computers will be about \$2,000 to \$3,000. Each council is to discuss at their individual meetings and will be discussed again at Trinity Parish Committee meeting in June.

AED training for St. John's. Gloria Heacock will provide AED and CRP training in June after a service.

New Business:

ELCA Video Crew: April 6 & 7 a crew will be at each church to highlight the Trinity Parish of Jackson County. They will be taking footage of the churches, be in church during worship and speak with some parish members.

Bug vacuum cleaner: A cordless handheld vacuum cleaner will be purchased by Julie B.

Bug Spraying and Window Cleaning: Mark will contact Chris Ries for bug spraying and Key City Windows for front door window cleaning.

Resume church cleaning: Julie Troy to start cleaning church again this week

Morning Prayer Service: Not a big success – Pas tor, Rev Laurie and Julie to discuss changing two songs.

Church Seating: Suggestion made that everyone sitting towards the front of church and together would enhance singing and spoken prayers in such a large setting.

From Sheep to Shepherd: An LSI Early Childhood Services Story

Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, a mother, recently released from treatment, found herself in her new empty apartment with her son. She felt lost and needed a shepherd to guide her. So, Hali contacted LSI's Early Childhood Services, and Gretchen O'Brien, a Family Support Worker, answered the call. Gretchen began virtual home visits using the Healthy Family America home-visiting model.

For the next three years, Gretchen connected Hali and her son to community resources, served as a support system and a shoulder to cry on, and celebrated Hali's sobriety milestones with her. Even when Hali doubted herself, Gretchen guided and believed in her.

"I just remember sitting in that empty apartment crying, but I had Gretchen on the phone. You guys believed in me when nobody else did," shared Hali.

Today, Hali serves on the Healthy Family America (HFA) National Parent Advisory Committee, the first of its kind. The group is composed of 10-12 parents from around the country who have graduated from their local HFA program, each participant with their own story to share.

Hali needed a shepherd in her time of trouble and self-doubt, and Gretchen answered that call. Now, Hali serves as a shepherd to thousands of parents through the National Parent Advisory Committee. The

LSI Early Childhood team couldn't be more proud of Hali and Gretchen.
